ALBERTA INGLIS SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Brant Animal Aid Foundation has established a \$1000 scholarship in the memory of Alberta Inglis for students pursuing post-secondary studies in the animal health field. Miss Inglis was a highly respected educator in Brant County who appreciated, understood and loved animals.

CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD

1. The award will be based on the recipient's academic performance and need for financial assistance.
2. Applicants must be accepted in a recognized course at a university or college that is directly related to the field of animal health or care.
3. Applicants whose goal it is to become a Veterinarian must have completed the prerequisite courses and be accepted into a DVM program to be considered a candidate for this Scholarship Award.
4. Applicants must have completed their secondary education within Brant County.
5. Recipients of the award are asked to initially research for job opportunities in Brantford/Brant.
6. The award is for a one-year period. Previous recipients may reapply.
7. The award will be paid to the institution of choice in the recipient's name after his/her acceptance has been verified.
8. The award money must be applied to the payment of tuition or books.

The available annual award is up to \$1000. It should be noted that this may or may not be awarded every year and could be awarded to one or more students.

Requests for consideration must be submitted on application forms from local veterinarian clinics in Brantford or Brant County, Student Services Departments in secondary schools in Brantford and Brant County or by accessing the Brant Animal Aid Foundation's Web Site www.brantanimalaid.ca

The closing date for applications is May 30th each year
